General Statement of Duties: The Outpatient Therapist provides individual, marital, family and group therapy to community clients (both children and adults).

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Conducts a comprehensive biopsychosocial assessment, including diagnostic impressions
2. Formulates time limited, goal-directed, and strength-based treatment plans
3. Provides therapeutic services using evidenced based methods
4. Provide a minimum of 25 billable hours weekly of direct service to clients on an assigned caseload
5. Presents a thorough clinical impression of a client's mental state and the efficiency of interventions at Clinical Consult Meetings
6. Provides supportive counseling and psycho-educational groups within assigned school
7. Completes all required documentation to agency standards in a timely manner
8. Develops discharge planning
9. Maintains client confidentiality
10. Attends all mandatory training as requested by supervisor
11. Possesses willingness to provide therapeutic services at any HFI office locations

Minimum Qualifications

Master's degree in social work, psychology, mental health counseling, or related field. Professional licensure (LSW, LCSW, LPC, LMFT) preferred but not required. 2 years of clinical experience with children, adults, and families preferred. Must obtain ACT 33/34 & FBI clearances. Must have reliable transportation. EOE
